

These tables were created by the Fiscal Research Division, a nonpartisan central staff division serving all members of the North Carolina House of Representatives and State Senate.

If approved by local voters, a county may levy an optional quarter-cent sales tax under G.S. 105, Article 46, enacted in 2007. To date, 46 counties have approved the tax; an additional 32 counties have held unsuccessful referenda.
