


These charts and tables were created by the Fiscal Research Division, a nonpartisan central staff division serving all members of the North Carolina House of Representatives and State Senate.

## Notes:

- (1) Funding sources for non-General Fund State employees include receipts, the Highway Fund, and Special Funds.
- (2) Figures reflect budgeted amounts. Figures do not include receipt-supported positions in local employers (i.e., public schools, community colleges).
- (3) Benefit costs include retirement, active health insurance, retiree health insurance, disability insurance, life insurance, and Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) contributions.
- (4) The fiscal year in North Carolina runs from July 1 to June 30.
- (5) This chart does not adjust for inflation.
